
It is recognized that there are other illnesses beyond COVID-19. As always, individuals who are sick with a fever of at least 100 degrees Fahrenheit must remain home until fever-free without fever reducing medication for twenty-four (24) hours. Also, if one has symptoms of an illness that are severe or uncomfortable enough to interfere with one's own learning or that of others, the individual needs to remain home until well enough to return to school. When a child feels sick at school, they should go to Mrs. Rubbe's Office for an assessment. If the child is determined to be too sick to remain at school, the School will contact parents/guardians to pick them up.
